Northwest Spay & Neuter Center uses qualified staffing and approved materials for all procedures performed. It is important for you to understand that the risk of injury or death, although extremely low, is always present just as it is for humans who undergo surgery. Carefully read and understand the following before signing your name.

- I, acting as owner or agent of the pet named above, hereby request and authorize Northwest Spay & Neuter Center, through whomever veterinarians they may designate, to perform an operation for sexual sterilization regardless of sex of the animal named above on this form.
- I understand that NWSNC may capture photography or videography of the awesome pets and owners that come through the clinic and I give my consent to share these on NWSNC media outlets and in marketing materials.
- I understand that the operation, use of anesthetics and drugs in providing this service, and other services provided can present some hazards and that complications, injury or death of this animal may conceivably result.
- I either certify that my animal has been vaccinated within one year prior to this date or waive my right to protect my animal by having it vaccinated prior to visiting the clinic. I understand that it takes up to two weeks for vaccinations to provide immunity to my animal.
- · I understand the inherent risks of failing to maintain current vaccinations (including kennel cough) and waive all claims due to such failure.
- I certify that my animal is in good health and has had no food since 12:00 midnight the evening prior to surgery unless otherwise instructed.
- I understand that Northwest Spay & Neuter Center has the right to refuse service to any animal to whom surgery is deemed a health risk, or the animal is unable to be handled by clinic staff.
- I understand that Northwest Spay & Neuter Center may not perform a complete physical examination before surgery is performed. I also understand that my animal will not receive pre-operative blood work and waive my right to have this service performed at a full-service veterinarian prior to surgery.
- I understand that some factors significantly increase surgical risk including but not limited to pregnancy, heat cycle, obesity, brachycephalic breeds, and diseases such as Feline Immunodeficiency Virus, Feline Leukemia, and heartworms.
- I understand that if my animal is pregnant, the pregnancy will be terminated at surgery and an additional charge applies. Pregnant animals will receive mandatory extended pain management (three days) at the owner's expense: pills for dogs, long lasting pain injection for cats.
- I understand that if my pet is cryptorchid (having an undescended testicle) an extra incision may be required. An additional charge applies.
- I understand that my pet may be treated for fleas at my expense. I understand that if my pet is not on flea prevention prior to being admitted, they are at risk for contracting fleas. Northwest Spay and Neuter Center will not be held liable if fleas are found after discharge.
- I understand if I don't retrieve my animal at discharge, NWSNC will exercise its right to turn over the animal to the appropriate agency in accordance with Washington State law. Owners of pets left after the agreed date and time shall be charged a boarding fee of up to \$10 per hour per pet. I understand that Northwest Spay & Neuter Center retains the right to report any abuse, neglect, or animal welfare concerns to the appropriate agency.
- I hereby release Northwest Spay & Neuter Center, all veterinarians, assistants, volunteers, directors, and employees from any and all claims arising out of or connected with the performance of all procedures or any adverse reactions from vaccinations. I agree that I have not and will not claim any right of compensation from them, or any of them, or file action by reason of such sterilization or attempted sterilization of such animal or any consequences related thereto. Owner/ agent hereby agrees to indemnify and hold Northwest Spay & Neuter Center harmless for any damages caused during the transportation of the animal, including transportation on the NWSNC shuttle, or for any damages caused by any unforeseeable events including fire, vandalism, burglary, extreme weather, natural disasters or acts of God.

YOUR ANIMAL WILL RECEIVE A SMALL MANDATORY TATTOO NEAR THE INCISION SITE TO SHOW THAT HE/SHE HAS BEEN STERILIZED.

AFTER CARE INSTRUCTIONS

NO STRENUOUS ACTIVITY:

- Your pet needs to take it easy for the next 10-14 days. Too much activity may cause the incision to open. Please make it your job to help them stay as calm and quiet as possible during the recovery period.
- No running, jumping or playing. They may need to be in a separate room or crate. Toys should be put away.
- Dogs may go for slow, leashed walks if they don't pull and can stay dry starting 48 hours after surgery.

CLEAN, WARM & DRY:

- The surgical area has been sealed with surgical glue which must stay dry. NO BATHS or water play for 10 days.
- Cats must stay indoors for 10-14 days; dogs must stay indoors for 10-14 days except to go out outside ON A LEASH to use to bathroom
- Pets must be transported inside the cab of your car or truck and NEVER in the bed of a truck.
- All pets will need to stay warmer than usual for 24 hours after surgery due to the anesthesia.

CHECK THE INCISION:

- Check the incision as soon as you get your pet home so you know what it should look like. Continue checking the incision twice each day to make sure it is healing properly.
- Incisions may look "rippled" due to a layer of stitches underneath the skin. This is part of the normal healing process.
- IF YOUR PET DEVELOPS A BUMP UNDER THEIR INCISION, it is likely because they have been too active and their body has formed a fluid pocket to help cushion the area. If there is no oozing from the incision, and your pet is eating, drinking and behaving normally, put even more effort into keeping them quiet and it should go away. If the bump is red or oozing or your pet is refusing to eat or drink, please call us at 253-627-7729 ext. 2 to go over your concerns.

NO LICKING:

- Licking will eventually open the skin where it has been glued together and force bacteria inside, causing an infection.
- We recommend you purchase an E-collar and your pet should wear it at all times when you are not watching them. Put it over
 their head, small end first. It should go past the end of their nose and be tied tight enough so you can only get two fingers under
 the tie. Your pet will not like wearing the collar. If they struggle at first DO NOT PANIC and take it off. Give them a chance to
 adjust. You can use your pet's own collar or harness to help keep it on.

FOOD:

- Offer your pet a small meal of their usual food when you get them home. Your pet may not feel like eating the first day home because anesthesia causes nausea. Appetite and activity level should return to normal within 24-36 hours.
- Do not change your pet's diet or give them a lot of treats or human food. Though it is tempting to spoil them after surgery, it is not good for them because it will likely cause stomach upset.

TATTOO:

• There is a small, green tattoo near the incision site on your pet to show they have been spayed or neutered. Some green ink may have spread around on your pet's skin while they were in recovery. This will wear off and the tattoo will heal very quickly.

PAIN MANAGEMENT:

- All animals receive an injection for pain and inflammation after surgery that will last 24 hours.
- **For dogs**: We offer a 3-day supply of pain medication to take home. Begin giving the medication the morning after surgery, *per the instructions on the label* on the bottle. The medication is best given with some food.
- **For cats:** We offer a long-lasting pain injection as an alternative to oral pain medication. This injection will be given to your cat before you pick them up and will last up to 72 hours.
- DO NOT give your pet any over-the-counter medications such as aspirin, Tylenol or ibuprofen. DO NOT use any information you may find on the internet to dose and administer these medications to your pet yourself. Though some human medications are also used in animals, it is VERY DANGEROUS to give them to your pet after surgery and without the advisement of a veterinarian.

VACCINES:

• Pets receiving their first set of vaccinations should receive a booster vaccine in 3-4 weeks. This does not apply to rabies, which is good for one year. We cannot do booster vaccines at our clinic. Please see your regular veterinarian.

<u>What is a Spay:</u> A complete ovariohysterectomy is performed. This is the surgical removal of the ovaries and uterus. An incision into the abdominal cavity is made located on the belly of your pet.

<u>What is a Neuter:</u> The surgical removal of both testicles is performed. The scrotum/skin is NOT removed. An incision is made just in front of the scrotum, or for younger dogs, in the scrotum (there may be an abdominal or other skin incision for cryptorchid neuters).

If you are concerned that your pet is having problems related to their spay or neuter surgery:

Please call our clinic at 253-627-7729, ext. 2. Our phones hours are from 10 am – 4 pm. Please leave a
message if we are unable to answer, and we will make it a priority to return your call. If necessary, our
veterinarian will perform a re-check exam free of charge. (You will be charged a small fee for any
medications prescribed.)

Please note:

- Your pet does not need to return to our clinic if they are healing normally.
- We cannot see pets that have had surgery at our clinic for medical issues not directly related to their spay or neuter surgery.
- We cannot see any pets that have not had surgery at our clinic.

Saturday - Sunday

• We do not have a veterinarian at our clinic on these days. Please see your regular veterinarian for any health concerns you may have for your pet.
